

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

MASTER LIST

This list is culled primarily from what we hear in the Complete Recordings of the TT, which is--in itself--mostly representative of what we hear in the Extended Edition of the TT. But this list includes all the singing that can be heard in association with the movie whether that be in the TE-DVD, EE-DVD, OST, CR, closing & fan club credits, and the TT Live to Film concerts. I have tried to list all the songs associated with TTT in the order they appeared (or might have appeared had they been used).

OST = Original Soundtrack - indicates a regular or special edition soundtrack CD.

TTT = The Two Towers regular or limited edition soundtrack CD / The number indicates the track number

CR = Complete Recordings of the TTT / First number = disc number ~ Second number = track number

0:00 - 0:00 = Time range for this track - when detailed time stamps exist, the range is a link to those stamps

* = Indicates that the same song appears more than once in this track - the time range encompasses all the occurrences

TE = Theatrical Edition of the movie

EE = Extended Edition of the movie

AS = Annotated Scores; free pdfs released in conjunction with the CRs

LYRICS AS SUNG

We have had a number of resources at our disposal over the past few years for determining exactly what is sung at any point in the score. But the most recent resource has been the phonetic lyrics for the TT Live symphony performances. Although we have suspected some mistakes in these (and past) phonetic lyrics, for the most part, we consider them correct. Or as correct as we're going to get.

Cautions:

The TT Live symphony is played live to the theatrical edition of the TT movie. So any singing heard during an extended scene is not in the symphony and we are left with all the resources we used prior to this latest one, the primary one being, "What can we hear?". As I wrote on my website, "Our ears are human, not Elven."

It's possible that what is sung in the TT Live symphony is not the same as in the actual soundtrack for the TE, the actual soundtrack for the EE, the CR, or the OST.

Even with the phonetic syllables, we must determine what actual words (or parts of words) these phonetic syllables represent.

So... how accurate are these? All I can say is this:

We who have set ourselves to the task take our work very seriously. I, as last arbiter of the matter, take it very, very seriously. I do not 'guess' and I do not publish 'guesses'. I and those I trust stay current on the latest info.

No one else is doing this. At least, no one that is not working with me. The only other major website to discuss lyrics has not been updated since Dec. 2005. The official information (primarily in the form of the AS) only provides the source text complete in 'poem' form along with an indication of when material from that source text is first heard. Not only is this not useful at all for 'singing along', some of this has been determined to be mistaken. So, this is pretty much all you got.

Although the same basic melody is in the movie, the singing is not. It matches with the music heard as Pippin is tearing at his brooch and spits it on the ground until the Uruk foot steps on it and the scene switches to our first glimpse of the Three Hunters.

According to the AS-TTT, the source song is 'The Missing', but we don't think so. These syllables don't match the text of 'The Missing' at all. 'Namarie' would make sense, since it's also used on the plains of Rohan in 'The Three Hunters'.

Here's what we know with some certainty. We know the source text is Namárië. We know the phonetic lyrics from the TTT Symphony choir lyrics. We know the chorus sings ominous fractures of "Namárië". (AS-TTT). What we are less certain about is exactly what syllables from Namárië can be matched to the phonetic syllables. Here's our best guess (phonetic lyrics are in all caps).

This music was originally written for the “Ride out to meet them” scene at Helm’s Deep but was removed from that scene and used for the White Wizard’s reveal in Fangorn. It’s a little unclear if the music as heard on the OST was actually intended for the Helm’s Deep scene or the Fangorn scene, but Doug Adams seems to indicate it was for Fangorn although I’m not sure this is the same mix as heard in the movies.

Although this scene has nothing to do with Shadowfax, lyrics from The Mearas were apparently used because it was close to Shadowfax's entrance. In the CR, these two scenes (The Ents Will Wake Up and Shadowfax's Entrance) follow one after the other. But in the TTT-EE movie, there is 26 seconds between the two pieces. I have it on good authority, however, that the lyrics are from The Mearas so I will accept it as so. The time stamps above were determined by others. I can't hear anything well enough to personally verify them.
